

Missouri Salary Reports Where does your school district rank? Evidence shows MNEA-bargaining locals earn the highest wages.

Missouri NEA represents employees in 75 percent of the top 20 highest-paying districts.

Missouri teacher salaries have been in the news the last few years for having some of the lowest salaries in the nation. Ranked 50th for beginning teacher salaries (\$34,052, 2023 NEA Benchmarks report) and 47th for average teacher salaries (\$46,944, 2023 NEA Rankings & Estimates), Missouri teachers are struggling to keep pace with the rest of the nation.

However, the national rankings may not tell the whole story. Missouri has 518 school districts, and even though many of those districts are paying below-average wages, Missouri NEA is proving that collecting bargaining works. Evidence shows that many of the highest teachers' salaries in the state are those districts that negotiate salaries.

Check out the **2023-2024 Salary Benchmarks & Rankings**, detailing the structure of district salary schedules and if the district is using the Baseline Salary Grant to supplement salaries, and the **2023 Salary Rankings** report detailing the average salaries of teachers, administrators, and superintendents.

The NEA Rankings & Estimates and NEA Benchmarks reports will be published in April/May

of 2024. Will Missouri move up from 47th in the nation for average teacher salary? Will we still place 50th in minimum teacher salary? Watch the website for news.

UNION MATTERS School employees vote in MNEA as exclusive bargaining representative

On May 29, 2007, the Missouri Supreme Court confirmed in its ruling of *Independence NEA vs. Independence School District* that public employees, including teachers and education support professionals, have a constitutional right to **"organize and to bargain collectively through representatives of their own choosing."**

Since 2007, MNEA local associations across the state have been organizing to achieve the ultimate goal of a legally binding contract agreement. Through good faith bargaining, school employees can negotiate salaries, benefits, and working conditions with their employers. MNEA would like to congratulate four more local associations on winning exclusive representative elections this school year.
